Dear Sisters in Christ,

The packet will include the convention agenda, directions to the church, and what to bring. Voting members will also receive nominees' biographies, proposed budget, and information about offerings and resolutions.

I will soon be calling on the voting members to fill convention committee assignments. I appreciate your willingness to serve on these very important committees. The Committee on Credentials makes the official registration reports. The Committee on Minutes reviews motions, seconds, and totals of votes and election counts. The Committee on Report of the President comments on the president's report and shares any recommendations. The Committee on Reference and Counsel studies and reports on resolutions and recommendations which come before the convention. The Committee on Conduct of Elections collects, tallies, and reports all election results to the convention.

The Board members and staff hope to see you at convention. Though our primary purpose is to do the business of the organization, it is an occasion to gather the women of the synod to share faith stories, learn from, support, and challenge one another.

May your cup overflow with peace, love and pure awesomeness this spring.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Convention is fast approaching and as the board is busy preparing I hope you are as well. Of course, you already know our 2019 convention will be held at St. Stephen's in Lexington, SC on June 7-8, 2019. The THEME this year is "Grace in Community" which combines two key elements of our organization. The scripture comes from Hebrews 4:16 "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need". The scripture along with a beautiful hymn "Grace Alone" helps to focus on our theme and also brings our focus to this year's project.

Our PROJECT this year will be two-part. The local portion will be focused on helping victims of human trafficking by asking congregations to create Freedom Bags that will be distributed throughout South Carolina as needed by Lighthouse for Life, a non-profit organization that provides education and training related to human trafficking in our

state. Also, we will be collecting monetary donations to support their ministry to sexual trafficking victims. I encourage all congregations to bring as many freedom bags as you are able, and remember there is still time to fund-raise by using a Thrivent Action Team. Our global project will be writing "Thinking of You/Thank You for Your Service" cards for our active duty military personnel here in South Carolina during convention. More on these projects can be found in the Action Committee's report.

Please find the convention REGISTRATION form and the workshop descriptions in this *Ripple*. Also, included are forms for running for the Board, Young Women and First-Time Guest registrations. Please consider running for the board, either as a board member or as secretary and think of inviting a young woman or a first time guest to convention. This is how we grow as a community; no matter their ages, all are welcome. If you are unsure if running for board is the right decision, please reach out to a board member or officer with questions. We work hard to serve God and we have fun serving you as your SC WELCA board.

Please make a special note that we will once again have VENDORS at Convention this year so don't forget to bring your checkbooks. We will have woodworking crafts, soaps, candles and greeting cards as well as SERRV, a fair trade non-profit organization.

If you will not have a delegate at convention, you may send your offering to me. Use of this envelope makes it so much easier to tabulate the offering for reporting to the convention on Saturday. Congregational units are also encouraged to include your semi-annual Joy Offerings. Monetary donations to the convention project – Lighthouse for Life - may also be noted and included in this envelope or given to the Mission Action Team along with the Freedom Bags when you arrive.

One half of the Convention Offerings are designated for our convention project – this year to provide support for the safe house and the victims of human trafficking at Lighthouse for Life. One half to the Convention Offering are designated for convention expenses. All of the Joy Offerings are sent to ELCA Good Gifts. All monetary donations to the convention project are given to Lighthouse for Life. Please make all checks payable to SC WELCA.

The final Treasurer's report for the February 1, 2018 through January 31, 2019 will be included in the Bulletin of Reports provided at convention. Also, a budget for the 2020 - 2021 fiscal year will be presented at the convention for adoption.

If you have any questions about your offerings or if you are a new Treasurer of your congregational unit and have questions, please let me know.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The SC WELCA Board Meeting was held February 9, 2019 at Camp Kinard, Batesburg-Leesville. Following are highlights from the minutes which will be posted on the SC WELCA website once approved by the Board at the next meeting.

- Becky will bring greetings from SC WELCA to the Lutheran Men in Mission at their annual convention on February 16that Wittenburg, Leesville.
- Lois Bylund, churchwide representative, will address the convention and lead a Bible study during her workshop. Lois was elected to the executive Board of WELCA for a second term and serves on the constitution review committee and as

convention coordinator.

- Mary Soltis will be attending the Conference of Presidents in Chicago in Becky's place. The board passed a vote for Becky's recommendation to deliver a \$600 free will offering to the Conference of Presidents, February 22-24. Free will offering will go to ministries as follows: 50% to ongoing churchwide ministries of WELCA; 25% -All Anew Campaign for Katie's Fund; 25% -Lutheran Suicide Prevention Ministry.
- From the Treasurer's Report: As of January 31, 2019, Summary sheet shows current cash assets are \$30,766.59 and at the end of the fiscal year was \$31,045.73. This includes a checking account balance of \$4,576.64, a savings account balance of \$10,805.99 and Mission Investment Fund CD of \$15,663.10. In addition, there is the Edna Corley Estate CD balance of \$35,630.71 from which the interest income for the year of \$883.64 has been transferred to our checking account for the SC LTSS Scholarship Fund. The 2018 budget of \$2,000 for Triennial gathering stipends were not disbursed and have been reserved for the 2020 Triennial. Motion passed.
- Julie Watson, 2019 Nominating Chair, reports the committee has received two nominations for secretary, two nominations for board member and two nominations for Triennial member. Eight nominations each for board and Triennial are needed.
- Convention: Kristin Snelgrove will be co-chair. Planning is under way with 7 workshops scheduled. Jen Thompson, from Lighthouse for Life, is the keynote speaker. The Journey Performing Arts Ministry will provide banquet entertainment. Caterer will be Diimmler's.
- The SC WELCA Triennial Promoter for the Gathering will be Risse Snelgrove. She will be taking applications for the \$200 stipends. The board passed a motion to award stipends only to non-voting members of the Triennial.
- The board passed a vote to transfer \$1,300 from the 2019 Budget toward the Triennial 2020.

WOMEN OF THE ELCA GATHERING JULY 16-19, 2020 | PHOENIX "Just Love" is the Gathering 2020 Logo and it reminds us that we are parts of one body. I'm so excited to share with you the news that we have been waiting for since July 2017.

Elizabeth McBride, director for intergenerational programs and editor of Café, designed our 2020 Gathering logo. Elizabeth stated that at the triennial gathering in 2017 closing worship service, and the Rev. Angela Khabeb exclaimed: "News flash! Christianity is not comfortable. If you are comfortable in Jesus, you're doing it wrong."

Following Jesus is messy. Loving one another is justice. We are not perfect, we are often broken, sometimes we don't fit. Sometimes our edges are rough – we are but one body in Christ.

Elizabeth stated, "The inspiration for the logo came after I walked around the downtown area of Phoenix, the site of the 2020 gathering. I noticed a mural located outside of the convention hotel. Its collection of broken mirrors, tiles, shards of plates and painted rocks ebbed and flowed in a kinetic frenzy color and textures."

We are the body of Christ

The mural reminded me of the body of Christ and how we are all misshapen pieces in a glorious and beautiful work of art. The palette of deep purple and bright green in the new gathering logo is reflective of the scenery of the valley in the Phoenix area. Along the streets of the city, dusty earth tones are punctuated with bright purple flowers and vibrant green cacti. The turquoise color connects to the history of native cultures in Arizona and the southwest region. The shade of red in our gathering logo is not one of fire and caution, but rather one of joy. Red signifies love.

As we embrace the theme "JUST LOVE", we remember the words of the Rev. Alexia Salvatierra at the gathering in Minneapolis 2017: "I believe that if we follow mercy all the way, go deep into mercy, we end up at justice."

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Jen Thompson our Keynote Speaker, is the Executive Director at Lighthouse for Life . She writes, "I first learned about the reality of human trafficking on an international scale in 2014. At that time I was in my 14th year teaching in the public school system in South Carolina. Upon learning about human trafficking I became heart broken and started doing research and realized this heinous crime was happening not only over seas but also in my home county. In February of 2015 I attended an awareness event and heard the

testimony of a survivor from Alabama. Her courage changed the course of my future. I began volunteering for Lighthouse for Life in the summer of 2015 and quickly became absorbed into it. I am honored to be a part of a ministry which has grown so quickly and served so many in such a short amount of time. The message is painful but necessary and the community has caught the passion. We must educate people on the realities of human trafficking and restore victims to wholeness. It's not an option it's an imperative. Lighthouse for Life is honored to be supported by individuals, businesses and faith communities all coming together in one movement bringing light to this horrible crime. We will stand for the darkness no longer."

Mr. Bob Healy, L4L's Director of Public Policy, will join Jen Thompson to provide an introduction of Lighthouse for Life. He will take a look at the model of supply and demand and shed light on the true root cause of this heinous crime. He will update us on new legislation possibly up for vote in SC to bring harsher penalties on commercial sex buyers.

Keynote with Jen

Heather Cook is the author of *Beyond* the *Bars: One Woman's Journey to True Freedom*. She will share her incredibly brave and strong story from bondage to freedom in her own words. She is a woman of remarkable courage.

Lois Bylund / Executive Board Member / Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

Lois Bylund was elected to the executive board of Women of the ELCA in July 2017 for a second term. She serves on the constitution review committee and as convention coordinator.

A resident of Moorhead, Minn., Lois is a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in that city. There she is an active member of her circle and served as unit president twice. Lois is currently serving as recording secretary of the Trinity Foundation Board at her church. She has also served on the church council and as a voting member of the synod assembly.

Lois has served on the planning committee and worked in the kitchen and dining room for the community Thanksgiving dinner hosted by Trinity Lutheran Church and St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Moorhead. She has also delivered meals to families and shut-ins and served as a United Way representative. Lois is an active member of the Blue and Bold Toastmaster's Club in Fargo, N.D.



Lois and her husband, Leon, have three children. She has worked for a hospital services company for many years and now serves as its operations coordinator. Lois enjoys crafts, refinishing and refurbishing furniture. She hopes to learn to quilt when she retires.

We look forward to having Lois at our convention. She will be leading a workshop with a Bible study titled "Hospitality" and will be bringing greetings from the Executive Board of the Women of the ELCA.

The Quality Inn is also close to St. Stephen's. They would not give us a group rate or reserve a block of rooms, but their rates are very reasonable.







GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATION OF YOUNG WOMAN GUEST / FIRST TIMER GUEST

Sponsored Young Woman Guest:

Any woman between the ages of 18 and 35 who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. The Sponsored YWG will have her convention expenses (fee, lodging and meals) paid for by either the Synodical Board or Conference. She will be housed with the other Young Women Guests at the convention. She will be a non-voting member at the convention, will attend the Young Women Guests Orientation, and will be seated with the other Young Women Guests during the convention. It is hoped that the sponsored Young Woman Guest will return as a delegate to following years' conventions.

Sponsored First Timer Guest:

Any woman of any age who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. The Sponsored First Timer Guest will have her convention expenses (fee, lodging and meals) paid for by either the Synodical Board or Conference. She will be a non-voting member at the convention, will attend the First Timers Orientation, and will be seated with the other First Timer Guests during the convention. 
