

#### VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As your Vice President, I am pleased to be your convention chair. By now you should have heard about our 2019 convention being held at St. Stephen's in Lexington, SC on June 7-8, 2019. The THEME this year is "Grace in Community" which combines two key elements of our organization. Grace is the foundation of our Lutheran heritage, and it is in community that we seek to live out our mission and purpose. The scripture comes from Hebrews 4:16 "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need". The scripture along with a beautiful new hymn, "Grace Alone", helps to focus our theme and also brings our focus to this year's project.

Our PROJECT this year will be two-part. The local portion will be focused on helping victims of human trafficking by asking congregations to create Freedom Bags that will be distributed throughout South Carolina as needed by Lighthouse for Life, a non-profit organization that provides education and training related to human trafficking. Our monetary donations will also support their ministry to sexual trafficking victims. Our convention's global project will be writing "Thinking of You/Thank You for Your Service" cards for our active duty military personnel. More on these projects can be found in the Action Committee's report.

Please find the convention REGISTRATION form and the workshop write-ups included in this *Ripple*. Also included are nomination forms for election of Board and Triennial Voting Members, and sponsorship of Young Women and First Timer Guests. Please consider running for the board, either as a board member or as secretary and think of inviting a young woman or a first time guest to convention. This is how we grow as a community, one person at a time. If you are unsure if running for board is the right decision, please reach out to a board member or officer with questions. We work hard to serve God and we have fun serving you as your SC WELCA Board.

The CONVENTION STAFF is busy planning. Our host conference coordinator, Emily Wright, and I are ready to sign up volunteers. We have plenty of opportunities to help so if you are in the Midlands Conference and you have not been notified and would like to take part in our convention, please contact Emily Wright at (803 479-5271 and/or free2gogma@yahoo.com) or me so we can get you involved.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT



A preliminary review of our February 1, 2018 through January 31, 2019 financial year is as follows:

- 1. Regular Offerings of \$24,988 have been received (69% of the budgeted amount of \$36,000). 65% of our Regular Offerings are sent to churchwide.
- 2. Joy Offerings of \$8,681 have been received (62% of the budgeted amount of \$14,000). 100% of these offerings are sent to support ELCA Good Gifts.
- 3. Designated gifts for Katie's Fund and Thank Offerings of \$415 have been received (35% of the budgeted amount of \$1,200) and forwarded to churchwide.
- 4. Special Offerings for Hurricane relief in SC and the US totaled \$891.
- 5. Conference donations of \$5,551 have been sent to SC charities.
- 6. 2018 Convention offering was \$5,298 compared to the budgeted amount of \$5,000 and monetary donations to the convention projects totaled \$18,750.
- 7. In total, budgeted expenses are at 99% of budget.
- 8. Net income from the Edna Corley Estate and Honorary and Life Memberships for SCLTSS Scholarship is \$1,896.

In summary, while Regular Offerings and Joy Offerings are about \$16,500 below budgeted amounts, monetary gifts to the 2018 convention projects was \$18,750, designated gifts to CWO plus special offerings for hurricane relief exceeded the budgeted amount for designated gifts by \$100, and total Conference support to local projects/programs was \$4,971. Thus, in total, support for SC WELCA programs/projects exceeded our expectations for this year.

Thank you! May we continue to be able to be a blessing to others.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT

The SC WELCA Board met on Saturday, November 10, 2018 at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Lexington.

Highlights from the meeting:

Becky expressed her appreciation for all who attended the fall meetings which were highlighted in the Fall Ripple along with spring meeting dates.

From the Treasurer's Report: Actual and Budget Receipts and Disbursements show Budgeted Receipts - \$62,783.67, Non- Budgeted receipts - \$7,969.51,

Budgeted Disbursements- \$59,507.40, Non-Budgeted Disbursements - \$7,302.75 with an Ending Balance of \$34,709.72. The board voted to send Benevolence balance of \$3,500 as follows: ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response for California Fires - \$875 and Florence Hurricane Relief efforts -\$875, Phoebe Hospital in Curran, Liberia - \$875, ELCA Good Gifts (International Emergency – Feed 8 refugee families for a month — \$800, Refugee Welcome Supplies for a week -\$55, 2 blankets - \$20.) VP Mary Soltis gave a progress update for the 2019 convention. The Board reviewed the 2019 SWO Convention Staff, proposed workshops, projects, entertainment, lodging, and prospective vendors.

There were 650 copies of the latest Ripple emailed. As of November 10, 2019, the number and percentage of links opened to view and/or download issues of the Ripple were: Fall *Ripple* - 47 %, and 57.5 percent for the 2018 Spring *Ripple*.

**Mission Action:** The non-profit agency, Lighthouse for Life, 7320 Broad River Rd, Suite K#247, Irmo SC 29063, was approved by the board with an email vote on August 17, 2018. The convention project is supporting Lighthouse for Life with Freedom Backpacks which contain personal hygiene items, wrapped candies/gum, water bottles, a Bible, and clothing items. The global project activity is signing and sending 500 "Thinking of You/Thank you for your service" cards to active duty military personnel.

**Mission Community:** Total attendance for the nine conference meetings was 336 and \$3,676 in donations to the following ministries: Dream Center, Foothills; Hope of Lancaster, Upstate; SC Hurricane Relief, Epiphany; Hebron Grace Home Amelia; Newberry Free Medical Clinic, Heartland; Lutheran Hurricane Relief, Midlands: Water Mission, Coastal; Patsy Amick (Speaker) and Flood Relief, Saxe-Gotha; I Care, Western. Honoring the military will be done by displaying pictures of veterans/active duty military on the mural and sending "Thank You for Your Service" cards.

Mission Growth: The Camp Kinard retreat will be held February 8-9, 2019, beginning with dinner at 6PM Friday and ending after lunch on Saturday. The video, *How Lutherans Interpret the Bible* by The Rev. Dr. Mark Allan Powell with Linda Roland (Lord of Life, Bluffton) leading follow-up discussions. The Isle of Palms retreat (April 26-28, 2019) Bible study presenter will be Ada Arthur.

**Triennial Stipends -** \$200 for 10 registered applicants for a total of \$2000 was approved by the board for the 2020 Triennial In Phoenix, AZ. The board also approved the process to award the stipends to registered applicants on a first call, first serve basis.

SC WELCA Goals for 2018-2019 were reviewed and approved by the Board and will be posted on the website.

SC WELCA can support Lighthouse for Life by participating in creating "Freedom Bags" that are given to the girls who are victims of sex trafficking throughout our state. Please see the items needed below to create these bags (attach the form to each bag denoting that all of the content is there). The backpacks help the girls as they are rescued with literally nothing but the clothes on their backs.

We can also support Lighthouse for Life financially by gifts that can be used to support the safe house and other items that the girls might need as they learn to recover and become empowered to be free. Checks are to be made to SC WELCA and we will then provide one amazing gift to Lighthouse for Life. Gift cards can be provided to restock the safe house, help buy groceries and other needed items. #### **2019 Convention Global Project**





#### GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATION OF YOUNG WOMAN GUEST / FIRST TIMER GUEST

#### Sponsored Young Woman Guest:

Any woman between the ages of 18 and 35 who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. The Sponsored YWG will have her convention expenses (fee, lodging and meals) paid for by either the Synodical Board or Conference. She will be housed with the other Young Women Guests at the convention. She will be a non-voting member at the convention, will attend the Young Women Guests Orientation, and will be seated with the other Young Women Guests during the convention. #### **Sponsored First Timer Guest:**

Any woman of any age who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. 
