

Proposed Rules of Procedures

Voting Member Body

Voting members of a convention shall be the elected officers and board members of the Synodical Women's Organization (SWO) and two voting members from each unit on the roll of this SWO.

Seating of Voting members

Voting members must present their credentials to the Committee on Credentials before being seated in the section reserved for them. Voting members must be registered by 9:00 a.m., Saturday, June 8, 2019. The roll of voting members may not be changed after 9:00 a.m., Saturday, June 8, 2019.

Quorum

A majority of the registered voting members shall constitute a quorum.

Appointment of Committees

The president shall announce the appointment of the following committees:

Committee on Report of the President

Committee on Credentials

Committee on Reference and Counsel

Committee on Minutes

Committee on Conduct of Elections

Privilege of the Floor

Seat and voice shall be granted to the following:

- 1. The representative of Women of the ELCA
- 2. Chairpersons of SWO committees, in connection with their reports
- 3. The Bishop of the SC Synod of the ELCA or the Bishop's representative
- 4. One representative from each congregation not represented by a unit (SC SWO Constitution ARTICLE VI, SECTION 2, Item2)
- 5. Others to whom the Convention shall accord this privilege

Conduct of Elections

The **VICE PRESIDENT** shall be elected for a term of two years by a nominating ballot. The vote will be completed for the Vice President before commencing a vote for the Secretary. Three-fourths of the votes cast shall be required for election for each of the first ballots, respectively. If no one is elected, the first ballot for each shall be considered the nominating ballot. On the second ballot, two-thirds of the votes cast shall be required for election. On the third ballot, the voting shall be limited to the two persons (plus ties) receiving the highest number of votes on the second ballot, and a majority of votes shall elect.

Proposed Rules of Procedures (cont'd)

The SECRETARY, and four (4) BOARD MEMBERS shall be elected for a term of two years. Four(4) TRIENNIAL VOTING MEMBERS shall be elected for the 2020 Triennial. The Nominating Committee shall nominate twice the number of persons for the vacancies to be filled. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. Nominations from the floor shall require permission of the person being nominated and biographical information shall be prepared for distribution at the time of the nomination. Biographical information must be received by the close of the last business session, Friday, June 8, 2018. A majority of votes cast shall be required for election. After the first ballot, voting shall be limited to the two (2) persons receiving the highest numbers of votes for each remaining vacancy.

Each election shall be completed before another election begins.

Voting Procedure

To be eligible to vote, a voting member must be seated in the designated voting member section. No proxy or absentee voting is permitted.

Voting cards will be used as follows:

Affirmative vote: GREEN Negative vote: RED

Speeches

All speeches in general discussion, unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds vote of the Convention, shall be limited to two (2) minutes. No person shall speak more than twice on the same issue without the consent of the Convention and only after all others have spoken. Speakers must use the microphone and identify themselves by name, congregational unit and city of congregation to be recognized by the chair.

Motions and Resolutions

Any voting member may make a motion or present a resolution from the floor if the motion or resolution is germane to the question under consideration. If any voting member desires to add any item of new business (that is, a motion or resolution of general character and not germane to a pending question), she shall:

- A. Write a motion or resolution on the appropriate form,
- B. Provide the signatures of five (5) voting members representing different units of the SWO, and
- C. Submit the form to the Committee on Reference and Counsel no later than the close of the last business session on Friday, June 7,2019.

The Committee on Reference and Counsel shall report to the Convention with its recommendation for handling such new business, which may include a recommendation that the matter not be considered. A two-thirds vote of the Convention shall be required to add the item of new business to the agenda.

Proposed Rules of Procedures (cont.)

All motions, other than routine ones, such as motions for approval of proposed action on, adjournment, etc., shall be presented in writing to the secretary before action is taken.

If anyone desires to distribute printed matter, not issuing from the secretary, it must be given to the Committee on Reference and Counsel for approval before distribution.

Attendance

Voting members shall not absent themselves from any meeting of the Convention without valid excuse.

Governing Parliamentary Law

Robert's Rules of Order–latest edition–shall be the governing law of this convention, except as otherwise provided in the constitution and bylaws.

Board Recommendations

- 1. That the proposed Rules of Procedure as printed in the Bulletin of Reports be adopted.
- 2. That the Convention program, which is outlined in the Bulletin of Reports, be adopted as the agenda for this Convention with changes as deemed necessary.
- 3. That the Audit Report of the Treasurer be adopted.
- 4. That the proposed budget for February 1, 2020 January 31, 2021, be adopted.

Report of the Synodical Board

The Synodical Women's Organization represents congregational and inter-congregational units throughout the Synod and is challenged to guide them in fulfilling the purpose of Women of the ELCA.

Duties of the board are to:

- Transact necessary business and make programmatic decisions between Conventions;
- Set policies required for effective and efficient functioning;
- Supervise and coordinate the work of all committees which the Board may appoint;
- Identify board members for networking between the churchwide organization and the unit in both programmatic and organizational concerns;
- Determine the time and place of each Convention;
- Prepare the proposed agenda, rules of procedure, and the program for adoption by each Convention;
- Report its actions to each regular Convention;
- Recommend the budget to the regular Convention;
- Fill vacancies in the offices and board membership until the next Convention;
- Determine the fact of the incapacity of an officer or board member to perform her duties:
- Act as constitution and by-laws committee;
- Act in such other matters as may be delegated to it by the convention of the synodical women's organization.

The synodical board is composed of four officers and eight elected members. Board members have attended board meetings, given reports, and spent many hours fulfilling their duties faithfully. Non-board members have served on various committees, as part of the Convention Committees, as Young Women Guests Coordinator, and as First Timer Guests Coordinator.

Report of the Treasurer

It has been an honor to serve as treasurer of the SC Women of the ELCA for another year.

The financial reports for our fiscal year February 1, 2018 through January 31, 2019 are included in this Bulletin of Reports (BOR). These reports have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and a letter of their review is included in the BOR.

In reviewing the financial reports, note that our Regular and Joy Offerings were again below the amount budgeted and have continued the decline over the last 5 years. However, the 2018 Convention Offering was just above budget and cash donations for our convention projects for the Lutheran Services Carolinas Love One Another campaign and to replace the furnishings for the girls' dormitories in Tanzania were \$18,750, far exceeding our expectations.

As shown in the reports, we sent 65% of Regular Offerings to Churchwide and 100% of Joy Offerings to churchwide for the ELCA Good Gifts. Designated Gifts and Special Offerings were received for Katie's Fund, Thank Offerings, and domestic disaster relief. In addition, Conference donations to various local projects totaled \$4,971 and the net income from Life Membership plus interest from the Edna Corley Estate provided an LTSS Scholarship of \$2,032. Board expenses, including the convention expenses, *RIPPLE* publication, postage and supplies, and insurance were all withinbudget.

In summary, total receipts exceeded total disbursements by \$1,458.

Thank you for your support of the work of SC WELCA and local and global programs and projects to help those in need.

The proposed budget for the fiscal year February 1, 2020 through January 31, 2021 will be presented during the convention. In total, the budgeted receipts and disbursements are projected to decrease again by 4% over the prior budget. The Stewardship Committee looked at the trends over the last 5 years for each major line item and made adjustments accordingly.

Thank you for support during the past year. God's Blessing to each of you and may you continue to be a blessing to others.

The Mission Growth Committee is committed to helping women to grow in their faith and in their sisterhood with activities that are carried out under the following goals:

- 1. Encourage women to attend retreats at Camp Kinard, the Isle of Palms, and the Wild Women Weekends at Lutheridge by providing information and publicizing activities.
- 2. Promote awareness of the 2020 Triennial Convention and Gathering in Arizona.
- 3. Provide information that encourages the building of relationships between generations through mentoring.
- 4. Support and promote ELCA church-wide efforts to address natural disasters, human trafficking, domestic violence, and hunger.

On February 8 & 9, 2019, a retreat was held at Camp Kinard. The topic of the retreat was *How Lutherans Interpret the Bible*, a series of videos by Dr. Mark Allan Powell. He stated that the Bible is the Word of God; it tells us what God wants to say to us. Powell explained that God's Word speaks both judgment and salvation and condemnation and redemption. He used many passages from the Bible to help explain how we should get meaning from the Scriptures. He talked about how we study the Scriptures and then put them into practice in our daily lives. Linda Roland from Lord of Life in Bluffton served as the facilitator and led the interesting discussions after the videos.

ELCA Definition of "Ecclesiastical Ballot"

In response to requests from synods for a definition of the ecclesiastical ballot and guidance on the use of such a ballot, the Church Council adopted the following definition in 1994:

To define an "ecclesiastical ballot" for the election of a bishop in synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as an election process:

In which on the first ballot the name of any eligible individual may be submitted for nomination by a voting member of the assembly;

Through which the possibility of election to office exists on any ballot by achievement of the required number of votes cast by voting members of the assembly applicable to a particular ballot;

That precludes spoken floor nominations;

In which the first ballot is the nominating ballot if no election occurs on the first ballot;

In which the first ballot defines the total slate of nominees for possible election on a subsequent ballot, with no additional nominations permitted;

That does not preclude, after the reporting of the first ballot, the right of persons nominated to withdraw their names prior to the casting of the second ballot;

In which any name appearing on the second ballot may not be subsequently withdrawn;

That does not preclude an assembly's adoption of rules that permit, at a defined point in the election process and for a defined period of time, speeches to the assembly by nominees or their representatives and/or a question-and-answer forum in which the nominees or their representatives participate; and

In which the number of names that appear on any ballot subsequent to the second ballot shall be determined in accordance with provisions of the governing documents (or, if the governing documents are silent, in accordance with rules adopted by the assembly).

Ecclesiastical Ballot

On the first ballot, the name of any eligible individual may be submitted for nomination by a voting member of the assembly.

Glossary of Terms

Assembly: ELCA's term for the gathering of voting members for a decision-making or legislative function

By-law: A standing rule governing the regulation of a corporation's or organization's internal affairs

CU: Congregational Unit

CWO: Churchwide Women's Organization

Churchwide Organization: The entire Women of the ELCA which is manifested in the WELCA triennial convention and the executive board; also used to describe the staff and office which support the activities of the organization

Circle/Group: A non-legislative grouping of women within a congregational unit, usually for the purpose of program activities, Bible study, fellowship, and personal growth, which meet regularly, and support the purpose of the Women of the ELCA

Conference: Grouping established by the Synodical Organization for the purpose of fostering interdependent relationships among congregations

Congregational Board: The women elected by the Congregational Unit to fulfill the various functions of the congregational unit; can be made up of officers, committee chairpersons and circle/group leaders

Congregational Unit: The women's organization in a congregation

Constitution: A legal document that outlines the name, purpose, authority, relationships, and financial structure of an organization

Contact Person: A person selected to receive and disperse information for the purpose of networking

Convention: The gathering of voting members for decision-making or legislative functions within Women of the ELCA

Designated Gifts: Offerings received above and beyond regular offerings which are sent to the Churchwide Women's Organization. Designated gifts make possible specific ministries of the ELCA and Women of the ELCA.

Executive Board: The officers and board member selected at the Churchwide Triennial; the highest level of authority of the Women of the ELCA

Gather: The magazine of the Women of the ELCA (formerly Lutheran Women magazine)

Gathering: Held immediately after the Triennial Convention for the coming together of the conference for workshops, Bible Study, fellowship.

Gifts: A type of designated gift for special projects determined by the organization

In Kind/ Love Gifts: Tangible gifts that can be given to a local agency or ministry from a gathering or convention

Inter-congregational Unit: A local organization for women from two or more congregations which have no congregational units

Interchange: Women of the ELCA newsletter mailed to congregational units; includes information from the Churchwide staff and Executive Board

Joy Offering: A special gratitude offering designated for the wider ministry of the ELCA.

Membership: Refers to the congregational/inter-congregational units who have affiliated with Women of the ELCA; it does not refer to individual women

Memorial: Resolutions brought by a synodical organization to the triennial convention

Participants: Individual women who choose to participate in a variety of activities which fulfill the purpose of the organization

Participation: Involvement that indicates a commitment to the purpose of the organization and is expressed in local and other settings; open to all women in the ELCA

Purpose Statement: States the purpose for the Women of the ELCA

Region: A geographic territory which includes several synods; our Region is 9; South Carolina is 9C

Regular Offerings: Received in circles/groups, general meetings, or through individual pledges; are the primary source of support for the ongoing ministries of the Synodical and Churchwide Women's Organization

Resolution: An item brought by a voting member (or voting members) to the convention for action

Resource Packet: Sent twice a year in the spring and fall to congregational units and contains new program information, stewardship materials and updates on the organization

SWO: Synodical Women's Organization

Special Offerings: A type of designated gift for the special projects determined by the organization

- **Synod**: A territory of the ELCA which has its own governing body
- **Synodical Board**: The officers and board members selected at the Synodical Convention; the highest level of authority of the Synodical Women of the ELCA
- **Synodical Women's Organization**: A legislative and programmatic entity that assists congregational and inter-congregational units within its synod to fulfill the purpose of Women of the ELCA
- **Thankoffering**: A gratitude offering which cannot be designated and is sent on Form B to Churchwide; used by the Women of the ELCA for *Gather* and resources.
- The Ripple: A publication of the South Carolina Women of the ELCA
- **Triennial Convention**: The convention of Women of the ELCA; the highest legislative authority of the Women of the ELCA that meets every three years
- **Triennial Gathering:** Held immediately following the Triennial Convention; the coming together of the Women of the ELCA for workshops, fellowship, and Bible study, and personal growth.
- **Unit Convention Offering**: Offering brought to the Synodical Women's Organization Convention by congregational units
- **Voting Member**: Eligibility is to be a participant in a Congregational Unit and a voting member of an ELCA congregation. Two are selected by each CU to represent their unit at the Synodical Convention with voting privileges. CWO assigns the number of voting members for each SWO, which are to be elected at the Synodical Convention, with voting privileges at the Triennial Convention.

Women of the ELCA: Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America
