Dear Sisters in Christ,



VICE PRESIDENT AND CONVENTION CHAIR REPORT

As your vice president, I am also pleased to be your convention chair. As many of you have hopefully heard, our 2019 convention will be held at St. Stephen's in Lexington, SC on June 7-8, 2019. The THEME this year is "*Grace in Community*" which combines two key elements of our organization. <u>Grace is the foundation of our Lutheran heritage</u>, and it is in <u>community</u> that we seek to live out our mission and purpose. The scripture comes from Hebrews 4:16 "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need". The scripture along with a beautiful new hymn "Grace Alone" helps to focus our theme and also brings our focus to this year's project.

Our PROJECT this year will be two part. The local portion will be focused on helping victims of human trafficking by asking congregations to create Freedom Bags that will be distributed throughout SC as needed. Also, in support of victims, we will be collecting monetary donations for Lighthouse for Life, a non-profit organization that provides education and training related to human trafficking in SC and also to support their ministry to sexual trafficking victims throughout SC. Our global project will be writing "Thinking of You/Thank You for Your Service" cards for our active duty military personnel overseas during convention.

Please find the convention REGISTRATION form included in this *Ripple*. Full workshop write-ups will follow. Please consider running for the board, either as a board member or as secretary. Also, please think of inviting a young woman or a first time guest to convention. This is how we grow as a community. If you are unsure if running for board is the right decision, please reach out to a board member or officer with questions. We work hard to serve God and we have fun serving you as your SC WELCA board.

The CONVENTION COMMITTEE is still planning everything. Our host conference coordinator, Emily Wright, and I have already met and have Midlands churches ready to sign up as volunteers. We still have plenty of opportunities to help so if you are in the Midlands Conference and you have not been notified and would like to take part in our convention, please contact Emily Wright or me so we can get you involved.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of September 30, 2018, we have received \$17,488 in Regular Offerings and \$6,667 in Joy Offerings. Sixty-five percent of our Regular Offerings are sent to churchwide to support the WELCA budget and 100% of our Joy Offerings are sent to the ELCA Good Gifts. Our Regular Offerings and Joy Offerings are about 50% of the budgeted amounts for the year. To meet our budget goals for this year Regular Offerings and Joy Offerings in the last 4 months of the year need to be approximately the same amount as we have received in the first 8 months.

Other receipts include \$300 from congregational units for Florence Hurricane relief, \$951 for life memberships, \$438 interest from the CD to support the LTSS Scholarship, \$411 for *The RIPPLE* subscriptions and an amazing \$35,313 from convention offering and projects.

In addition to sending our Regular and Joy Offerings to churchwide, disbursements include convention expenses of \$14,532, donations of \$21,559 to our 2018 convention projects for Lutheran Services Carolinas and Tanzania, *The RIPPLE* publication expenses of \$1,857 and Board and committee expenses of \$1,718.

May God continue to bless us so that we can be a blessing to others.

The first SC WELCA Board Meeting was held Sunday, August 12, 2018 at Mt. Horeb Lutheran Church, Chapin. Here are highlights from the meeting:

- Thank you cards and letters: Ted Goins, Jr. President, Lutheran Services Carolinas for our contributions in support for the Love One Another capital campaign; Charlene Fink, for contributions for the Tanzania Dormitory Project; Anna Sarver, for the hospitality extended.
- President Koch welcomed new board members: Amanda Sease-Baker, Kristin Snelgrove, and Rae Davis.
- Adopted/approved by the board: 2019 Convention theme "Grace in Community"; theme scripture Hebrews 4:16; logo a graphic with multicolored people in a circle with a cross in the center; theme hymn *Grace Alone*.
- Nominating Committee 2019: Julie Watson, Paulette Miller, Cecilia Dunlap, and Brenda Byrd. Positions for vote are Vice-President (ecclesiastical), secretary, and 4 board members, and 4 Triennial voting members. Elsa Hope is not eligible for nomination for Secretary.
- Vice President Soltis gave summaries of the 2018 convention evaluations and progress update for the 2019 convention.
- Committee Action Chair Sarah Cheesman briefed the board about Lighthouse for Life, a non-profit agency which focuses on domestic minor sex trafficking and the support they need for their Freedom Bag Ministry; Sarah will research further whether Lighthouse for Life will be the recipient of SC WELCA donations. ** Sarah made a motion for Human Trafficking to be the local project. The motion was seconded; MOTION PASSED.
- Mission Community Chair Amanda Boatwright reported the committee's promotion of various events and communications supported by SC WELCA (National Day of Prayer, Bold Women's Sunday, Facebook, SC WELCA website, and other publications) and passed out the Fall Conference meeting list.
- Mission Growth Chair Dianne Lominick encouraged retreat attendance at Camp Kinard (February 8-9, 2019).
 Dianne made a motion that former board member Linda Roland facilitate the 7-part video series *How Lutherans Interpret the Bible* by The Rev. Dr. Mark Allan Powell for the Camp Kinard retreat. The motion was seconded; MOTION PASSED.
- Sherry Fowler, Editor/Circulation Manager gave *The Ripple* and SC WELCA Website reports.
- Board reviewed Calendar of Events for 2018-2019 activities; finalized committees and chairs; finalized the liaisons for conferences; committee assignments were announced.

RECIPE CORNER

2 packages of 8oz cream cheese

1 package of dry ranch dressing

SC Women of the ELCA Goals for 2018- 2019

The 2018-2019 goals for SC Women of the ELCA are based on the Women of the ELCA Purpose Statement. An expanded version, which has specific goals for each section, may be found on the SC WELCA website.

"Community of Women" – We are a group of women created in the image of God and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We are called to develop and engage an inclusive movement to bring all women into fellowship and ministry for community.

"Disciples of Jesus Christ" – We are followers of Jesus who strive to live in the way of Christ.

"Grow in Faith" – Through faith opportunities and using resources available, we are growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and experience it at work in our lives as we disciple and minister to each other.

"Affirm our Gifts" – Led by the Holy Spirit, engage in a discernment process of our best gifts and use these gifts to serve God and serve others.

"Support one another in our callings" – Provide financial support and offer faith opportunities for women to share God's grace.

"Engage in Ministry and Action" – We respond to discipleship by serving others.

"Promote Healing and Wholeness" - United in love, we are called to act with justice, which is faith in action.

Nominating Committee

Now is the chance to let your light shine! The nominating committee is seeking brave women to step forward and allow your names to be put into nomination for positions of secretary or board members. We need a secretary who will use her gifts of organization and accuracy to keep minutes and perform other duties as required of her office. There must be at least 2 nominees for that position. If you are seeking a means to use your gifts and have fun at the same time as well as developing closer relationships with your fellow WELCA sisters, you might prefer to run for state board. We need at least 8 candidates to fill 4 positions. Vice President will be elected by ecclesiastical ballot.

If you do not feel called to serve in either capacity, perhaps you can encourage someone else whom you feel would be well suited for candidacy. Requirements for being a nominee are that you be a participant in a congregational unit, a member of the ELCA, and have a willingness to serve at least one two-year term.

Since we are called to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another, engage in ministry and action and promote healing and wholeness, serving in one of these positions is the ideal way to fulfill our purpose. Please give prayerful consideration to serving our state organization by allowing your name to be put into nomination. Should you be elected, there will be plenty of help, encouragement and advice when called for.

Elections for Voting Members for the Triennial Convention

We will be electing four voting members to represent SC WELCA at the Triennial Convention in Phoenix, AZ in 2020. The convention is set for July 14-16, 2020. All travel and lodging will be paid by WELCA for our President and the four voting members. The WELCA constitution provides two criteria that need to be met in the election of voting members for the triennial convention:

1. as nearly as possible, at least 10% of the delegation shall be persons of color or whose primary language is other than English;

2. at least one-fourth of the voting members shall be women attending the convention for the first time.

The deadline for nomination forms for Board, secretary, and Triennial Voting Members is **March 31, 2019**. Please feel free to contact the following ladies with any questions, and may God bless you as you make your decision.





GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATION OF YOUNG WOMAN GUEST / FIRST TIMER GUEST

Sponsored Young Woman Guest:

Any woman between the ages of 18 and 35 who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. The Sponsored YWG will have her convention expenses (fee, lodging and meals) paid for by either the Synodical Board or Conference. She will be housed with the other Young Women Guests at the convention. She will be a non-voting member at the convention, will attend the Young Women Guests Orientation, and will be seated with the other Young Women Guests during the convention. It is hoped that the sponsored Young Woman Guest will return as a delegate to following years' conventions.

Sponsored First Timer Guest:

Any woman of any age who has never attended a SC Women of the ELCA Convention is eligible for nomination. The Sponsored First Timer Guest will have her convention expenses (fee, lodging and meals) paid for by either the Synodical Board or Conference. She will be a non-voting member at the convention, will attend the First Timers Orientation, and will be seated with the other First Timer Guests during the convention. It is hoped that the sponsored First Timer Guest will return as a delegate to following years' conventions.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Congregational Unit President:

Complete no more than two (2) Nomination Forms and mail to your Conference Coordinator <u>no later</u> than April 10, 2019. The order in which nominations are received will be a factor in the selection decision. The Synodical Board will sponsor (pay for) one Young Woman Guest and one First Timer Guest from each conference. The Conference may sponsor additional persons as their funds permit.

Conference Coordinator:

- 1. Ask for vote at the Fall Conference Meeting how many nominees will be sponsored by your Conference. A sponsorship is approximately \$100.00.
- 2. After April 17, 2019, confer with your Officers and Board Conference Liaison to select the Board-sponsored nominees and, if applicable, the Conference-sponsored nominee(s). Alternate nominees should also be selected in the event the primary nominees are unable to attend the convention. Mark the method of payment on each sponsored nomination form (by Synodical Board or Conference). The Nomination Form will take the place of the Registration Form for the sponsored persons.
- 3. Notify each of the unit presidents and nominees of decisions made.


